



2010 Bentley Student Design Competition *Rules and Requirements*

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Use of Bentley product(s) is *required* (use of Generative Components will automatically place a project in the Computational Design Category)
- Write a short essay, minimum 150 words, clearly defining the project's objectives, how those objectives were met, as well as why the project is superior. (Essay will be entered via the online submission form)
- Create a PowerPoint presentation, no more than 5 to 6 slides, that explains the following on individual slides:
 - Project concept and goals
 - Design process and execution
 - Results
- Send or upload your project's supporting design files and images:
 - One self and/or team photo
 - Two to four supporting project images
 - Movie/AVI files (if applicable)
 - Sample DGN project files (if applicable)
 - All images must be high resolution and preferably a minimum of 3825 pixels wide x 2475 pixels tall.

CONTEST RULES/ ELIGIBILITY

- Projects **MUST** be created utilizing Bentley software as the primary technology.
- Projects are required to be submitted via the online submission form.
- Students from secondary schools and technical schools are eligible to enter the Bentley Student Design Competition in the University/Collegiate level as long as they use Bentley Solutions to create their project.
- Students may enter the competition in teams not to exceed three contributors per team
- Nominee(s) warrant that they have received all necessary approvals and authorizations from such individuals to accept the terms of the Participation Agreement (within the online submission form) with respect to the project submission.
- Nominee(s) agree to abide by the terms of these official rules and by the decisions of the independent Student Design Competition judges, which are final and binding on all matters pertaining to the Bentley Student Design Competition.
- Based on actual submissions the final competition categories are subject to change.

- The project must be completed in its entirety by students. Any project that received contributions from others, such as instructors, parents, or professionals, or any individual who is not listed, will be disqualified.
- Bentley assumes no responsibility for failure of any project to be received by the deadline due to incomplete or late submissions.
- The Bentley Student Design Competition is not open to employees of Bentley or its integrators and resellers.
- Scholarships are team based
- Bentley reserves the right to disqualify projects that fail to meet these rules and requirements.

DEADLINE

All project submissions as well as all supporting images and PowerPoint's must be received by **February 26, 2010.**
